Céline Arseneault, botanist and librarian at the Montréal Botanical Garden, received the Charles Robert Long Award of Extraordinary Merit on May 2, 2014 from the Council on Botanical and Horticultural Libraries (CBHL).

This award recognizes Arseneault's extraordinary service to CBHL for her significant contributions to the health and vitality of CBHL by developing the CBHL website, her deep commitment to and passion for the organization, her willingness to welcome and mentor new members, her knowledge of cutting edge information management technology and for advancing the Montréal Botanical Garden Library into an essential hub of activity, learning, and documentation.
